Last week we found out that God likes to use the small, the poor, the foolish, the little things... for His BIG DREAMS!

v. 10 – Yet another pity party

List of reasons why God can't use him

When you complain about yourself or others
You are really complaining about the Creator (v. 11)

v. 12 – God's greatest promise = His presence!

Not just in general, but to his mouth and words.

Moses' fear – That he isn't good enough for God to use.

Eloquent speech isn't as important as power in words!

Eloquence will never go as far as effectiveness!
How about you? Maybe you don't think your life,
talents, or conduct isn't as good as others.

Are there others more graceful, talented, maybe there
words or even their life is more “eloquent” than yours?

But that doesn't mean that God can't still be effective
through you and your life!

My Most Effectiveness – Not from the pulpit

*Effectiveness is rarely produced in the spotlight,
but instead effectiveness is in the little things.*

Not in the pulpit, or up front of groups of people...

But in your home, with your family, talking to someone one on one as a friend, or even just hugging someone.

True effectiveness comes when a person allows God to use them in the circumstances of everyday life.

v. 13 – But Moses still is weak and doubts.

Remember he isn't just doubting himself – but God!
And this angers the Lord (v. 14)

But God doesn't take away His relationship with Moses, He doesn't him condemn to Hell.

Instead God compensates for Moses' weakness

"O Brother, Where Art Thou?"

He brings in another to help Moses in his time of failure

You know, we need each other. As brothers and sisters in Christ, we need one another. I need you!

90% of church work is done by 10 % of the people

10 % of the rest of work is done by only 90 % of people

This is a sad fact! *"O Brother, Where Art Thou?"*

Your brothers and sisters need you!
